

## PROGRAM SUMMARY

- **Credit Hours:** 120 hours
- **Concentrations:** Adapted Curriculum
- **Declaring the Major:** Minimum of 2.5 GPA requirement; Passing scores on all three parts of the Praxis Core or acceptable alternatives (SAT or ACT scores); Grades on EDUC 1100 or EDUC 2100 and SPED 2100 of “C” or better. Students must also complete an “*Application for Admission to a Teacher Education Program*” in the Office of Teacher Education Advising, Licensure, and Recruitment (TEALR) in the College of Education. This should occur after a student has earned at least 30 semester hours of coursework.
- **Advising (For the Major):** Required immediately on admission to the major and at each registration period by the undergraduate special education advisor in the Department of Special Education and Child Development. Course permits may be required, and these can only be obtained through the department.
- **Advising (For General Education):** By advisors in the Office of TEALR in the College of Education during the freshman and sophomore year.
- **Minimum Grades/GPA:** GPA of 2.5 or higher must be maintained; Grades in professional education and concentration coursework must be “C” or better and the overall GPA in these courses must be a 2.75.
- **Teacher Licensure:** YES, the Special Education program provides a K-12 license in both Special Education: Adapted Curriculum and/or Special Education: General Curriculum.
- **Evening Classes Available:** NO (Some courses may be taught in the evening; however, the major cannot be completed by taking evening classes only.)
- **Weekend Classes Available:** NO
- **Other Information:** A yearlong internship (YLI) is a requirement for completion of the major. This YLI must begin one semester prior to student teaching. An application is required for admission to the YLI and must be completed early in the semester prior to beginning the internship - see Office of Field Experiences’ website ([ofe.uncc.edu](http://ofe.uncc.edu)) for YLI application deadlines. Student teaching is required the last semester upon completing all other coursework required for the major. Student teaching requires an additional application, that students meet all GPA requirements, and includes the undergraduate advisor’s recommendation.

## PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

The Special Education (SPED) major has a *very structured* curriculum. Freshmen and sophomores who intend to major in Special Education are classified as Pre-Education majors in Special Education. During the pre-education phase students are advised by TEALR advisors regarding General Education.

Upon completion of the education prerequisite courses and 30 hours, students may be admitted to the SPED program as majors. Upon admission to full-standing in the program, students are to meet with their SPED advisor, where they plan the remainder of their program of studies (typically the second semester of the sophomore, junior, and senior years).

Minimum criteria for admission to the SPED program:

- Completion of EDUC 1100 or EDUC 2100 and SPED 2100, with a minimum grade of a “C,” by the end of the semester of application.
- 30 hours of coursework.
- An overall GPA (Grade Point Average) of 2.5.
- A passing score on the PRAXIS Core exam.

<b>General Education (not satisfied by other major requirements)</b>	31-35	These course requirements vary with a student's experiences. In some concentrations, courses may count for both Gen Ed and the requirements of the concentration. Does not include required writing intensive and oral communications courses which are included in the major.
